The Lighting of the Advent Candle – Fourth Sunday of Advent

Priest: Today we light the first, second, third and fourth candles of the Advent wreath. Each candle has a meaning. The first candle is HOPE. The second candle is PEACE. The third candle is JOY, and the Fourth candle is LOVE. *(The candles are lit.)*

Scripture: John 13:34 Jesus said to them, "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

Prayer: (Said by All) Oving God, your mercy and compassion endure forever. Open our hearts, that we may receive your love; and following the example of your Son, spread that love to a love-starved world. Through Jesus Christ, who loved us to the end. AMEN.

The Holy Gospel: Luke 1:39-45(46-55)
